

Vincent-Immanuel Herr is an author, activist, and speaker from Berlin. His work focuses on European integration, youth empowerment and gender equality. As part of HERR & SPEER, he has spearheaded the FreeInterrail campaign and successfully lobbied the European Commission to introduce the DiscoverEU mobility programme for the bloc's 18-year-olds, for which he was awarded numerous prizes.

Professor Helen Drake is Director of the Institute for Diplomacy and International Governance (IDIG) at Loughborough University London. Previously at Loughborough University's Midlands campus, she has published on contemporary France. She is a member of the Scientific Council of ESSCA (École de Management) Angers, France and of the Expert Committee for the research network Alliance Europa, Pays de la Loire (France) and former Chair of UACES.


