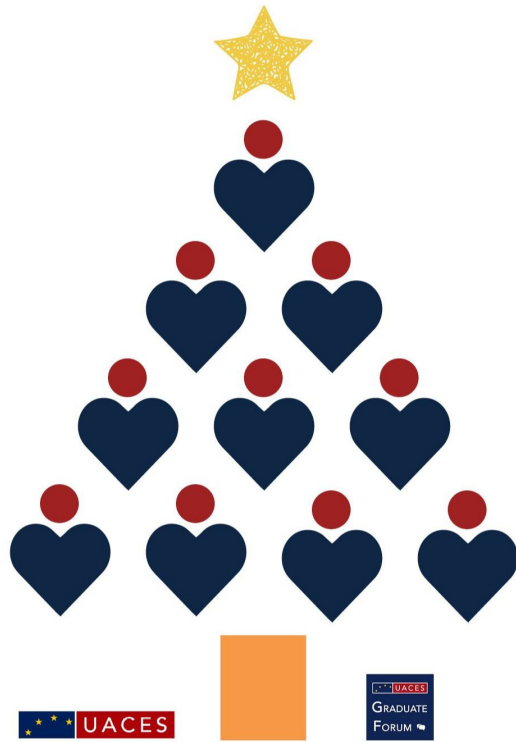

- Maximum number of entries you are happy to judge

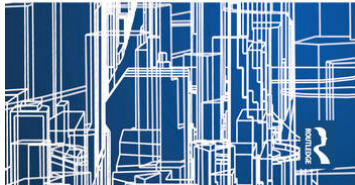
